(iv) Contrast in the quantity of the consonant.

The alternation between single k, c and double kk, cc respectively 'makes the onomatopoeic words into two different words. Some times the addition of a consonant also makes a difference in meaning.

(v) Free variation in the quality of the vowel.

Contrary to the contrasting alternations mentioned above there are alternations which do not make any difference in meaning. These are just free varying forms. The same onomatopoeic sense is expressed by both the alternating sounds.

There is free variation between u and a, u and e, u and o, e and a, a and i, e and o, i and u. These variations do not affect the onomatopoeic value of the words.

It is to be noted here that there is no contrast between the alternating sounds at least in some dialects of the spoken Tamil. For example r and r, 1 and !, 1 and 1 have merged in some dialects. u when followed by a in the second syllable becomes o in spoken Tamil. Therefore these variations can be taken as dialect variations. But there are the other variations which have to be taken into account as variations which do not have onomatopoeic significance.

But curiously the same sounds which contrast and give two different meanings are in free variation without affecting the meaning. This can be found out by comparing the list of sounds given as in contrast or in free variation. Therefore the contrast or free variation is not with reference to those particular sounds but with reference to the particular onomatopoeic expressions.

(ix) Different forms for one conception

In the cases above mentioned, there is a difference of only one sound and this difference does not change the meaning. There are expressions which are quite different in form but they mean the same thing. They have been listed below. As already pointed out under Imitatives, it shows that even the phonetically motivated words are subjective to some extent and one and the same conception is experienced and expressed differently.
